



NEW GROUP TO PROMOTE LAWN BOWLS

Men's Southwest Division president Mert Isaacman has organized a new membership marketing development committee chaired by MacKenzie Park's Stan Bloom. Committee members include: former SWD presidents Sam DeLisle and Joe Siegman, SWD website masters Myra Chan and Len Cormier, Jan Hargraves, Charlie Hebert, Jason Kelso, Dave Stennis, Dee McSparran and John Groothius.

The committee will concentrate its efforts on providing support to member clubs in three areas: Recruiting, Retention and Fund Raising.

Recruiting support will include; open house guidelines, a trifold 4-color brochure, advertising templates (for newspaper/magazine ads), and publicity how-to guidelines. The committee is also considering providing man/womanpower and financial support to assist member club's open houses.

Retention support will include: a new member

"welcome" packet, a coaching manual, and competition/tournament guidelines.

Fund raising guidelines will be developed for tournament sponsorship solicitations and member contributions.

Via a new website—www.swlawnbowls.com—an outreach program will be available to answer questions and give advice on recruiting/open houses, retention issues, news/publicity programs, advertising, coaching, greens maintenance, and league and tournament programs, as well as other club issues.

Bloom says that more plans are in the works and will be announced as they become available.

The chairman reports that he is extremely pleased "that the committee includes five new bowlers and three women, each of whom brings new and innovative ideas to the table, as well as a positive can-do attitude for the future of our sport."

BEVERLY HILLS' ANNE BARBER ELECTED TO USLBA HALL OF FAME

The USLBA has elected Southern California champion Anne Barber to the National Lawn Bowling Hall of Fame.

The Beverly Hills LBC stalwart represented the United States at the quadrennial 1992 Women's World Bowls Championships in Scotland and 1996 World Championships in England. She was a member of Team USA at the biannual Atlantic Rim Games in 1993, 1995 and 1997, and the Asia-Pacific Championships in 1995 and 1997.

Arguably the top American women's bowler from 1986 to 1996, Anne won National Open Singles titles twice, Open Pairs championships three times, and one Open Triples crown. She also won the U.S. Championships Pairs in 1992 and Singles in 1995.

Barber's Southwest Division victories include U.S. Pairs Playdowns in 1992, 1993, 1996, 1998, 2000, and U.S. Singles Playdowns in 1995 and 1999. She also won ten Southwest Open titles between 1991 and 1998: Singles, Pairs and Four three times each, and one Triples.

Anne and her late husband, Juda, emigrated from Johannesburg, South Africa in 1986, where she had already achieved marquee status as a "Sprinkbok"- national team member. A winner of numerous SA national and major regional bowls titles between 1960 and 1985, she represented South African bowlers at the 1969 and 1981 Maccabiah Games.

IT'S CALLED "ETIQUETTE"

There's a booklet, "The Etiquette and Courtesy of the Game of Bowls", produced by the South African Bowls Association. Its' guidelines, references and suggestions are used by bowlers throughout the outdoor and indoor bowling world.

The booklet begins—"The game of bowls, whether competitive or social, is played in an atmosphere of fellowship and sociability. This atmosphere is maintained by a traditional code of behavior, with its roots in common courtesy...not only between opponents, but also between teammates, club officials, club members and spectators."

What follows is a sampling of the booklet's comments on "Team Etiquette":

1. Refrain from unnecessary movement and talking when an opponent is on the mat.
2. It is both a rule and etiquette that players at the head stand at a minimum distance of two meters behind the jack. Players should also stand two meters behind the mat.
3. When crossing over between the mat and head do not trespass into an adjoining rink or cause annoyance to its players.
4. Do not carry on a running commentary as each delivered bowl makes its way to the head.

5. Do not grumble, keep quiet, if your opponent gets a good result from a fluke shot.

6. Keep in mind the better bowler usually has the better luck.

7. Do not say "thank you" if your opponent gives the shot away. If you must say anything say "bad luck".

8. If an umpire is called to measure, all players must leave the head and await the umpire's decision, which is final.

9. Do not argue with your skip about the shot he asks you to play.

10. Don't make excuses for bad play. Remember your opponent had the same conditions to contend with.

11. It's a nice gesture to commend a good shot played by a teammate or opponent.

12. No head should be broke-up (raked) until both vices have agreed to the number of shots conceded.

13. The deepest principle in human relations is a desire to be appreciated. So never neglect an opportunity acknowledge a good shot.

14. Avoid making adverse comments about a member of your team.

THE BIASED BOWL

Recently, a MPLBC member confided to me that, on occasions, he/she says a prayer that an about-to-be-delivered bowl not be an embarrassment.

I found this remark very interesting because it brings up the question of divine intervention in lawn bowls. Or, as phrased by a fellow member, "Can the pious bowler expect biased consideration from on high?"

I thought about my own recent lawn bowling efforts, some of which were humiliating, and pondered whether prayer might have exerted a positive effect in sending bowls nearer to the jack. Admittedly, this is a delicate subject and I have no intention of discussing it vis-à-vis any particular religious persuasion.

Relevant to this subject, however, I once asked a distinguished clergyman of my faith whether or not I could expect God to listen to a supplication that an airplane I was about to board arrive safely. The answer was an unequivocal, "Yes!"

I thought long and hard about this. Then I realized that

I hadn't followed up with a second point of discussion, because listening to a supplication and granting it are two entirely different things. I think we would all agree that no human being, regardless of religious affiliation or expertise, can conclusively know which prayers the Lord listens to, or acts on, and which are ignored. Oh yes, I have some strong ideas about this but I freely admit my answers carry no more weight than anyone else's.

Still another question is whether or not an unbeliever is at a disadvantage if the bowlers around that person are praying for success (or, to avoid failure) and this person has no such recourse. Perplexing, huh!

I have wondered about this dilemma for more than a couple of hours—yes, we retirees have the time to do this—and I have decided that while our creator (if you believe) may find lawn bowls as interesting and compelling as we do, there are more important matters for concern. But, can a whispered prayer every now and then do any harm?

I feel these ideas are ripe for exploitation by Hollywood. Is it too far fetched to envision a film depiction entitled "Greens of Dreams" or "A Bowl Too Far?"

Hugh, a pal of bowls enthusiast Walt Disney, was a member of Escondido, San Diego and Smoke Tree clubs, and first stepped onto a bowling green during the 1950s. Chuck, one-time Riverside LBC president, husband of national women's champion Kottia Spangler, had been lawn bowling since the 1970s. Both were familiar occupants of tournament winners circles and active through the years in Southwest Division development and organization.

DEAR DR. GOODWICK.....

RX for more consistent excellence

Dear Dr. Goodwick,

We had a round robin tournament at our Club. One of the teams claimed their opponents forfeited by not returning from lunch in time for their scheduled game. I presume they should be given a "win" in the round robin, but what "plus points" should be awarded, if any?

Dear Lookin,

Any plus points awarded in that situation must be determined by the governing body, i.e., the person or persons who have ultimate responsibility for that tournament.

That issue and others should have been discussed, determined, and communicated to all players before the beginning of the tournament. Most Clubs just bumble ahead with their in-house tournaments, hoping nothing extraordinary or complex like this will come up. Too often, some extraordinary incident does come up, and then the whole Club looks lame.

Now that it's "after the fact," the decision basically only includes two choices:

1. Award some plus-points.
2. Award no plus-points.

If #1 is chosen, a standard award of three has been used, five has been used, and a mathematical

average of the winning margin in every other game of the tournament has been used. Of course, the tournament has to be nearly complete before the average can be determined. On the other hand, by that time, wins, ties and losses can make the issue of plus-points meaningless, so you might not have to do any math at all.

The big question is: "Who constitutes the governing body at your Club?" Is it the Tournament Director? Is it the Executive Board? Or is it the TD and EB together?

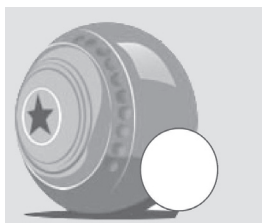
Why is the governing body and its pre-tournament responsibilities important? Because having these basic rules and policies make for fair and smooth-running events. Not having them often means that decisions are made on the spur of the moment, when there is much greater likelihood that someone's rights (or feelings) will be abused.

A Club can't expect to retain members if it appears that it's making up the rules as they go along. Bowls is about competition, and people who compete are very concerned about having a fair and equal playing field. Setting up the rules and competition conditions before a tournament begins is usually the responsibility of a Club's Executive Board. All of bowls pays a price when those responsibilities are ignored.

HOLMBY & LONG BEACH WINTER LEAGUE CHAMPS

Seventeen teams from ten clubs entered the 2007 Winter League, involving more than 80 bowlers. This year's competition was divided into a 'first tier' league – called the Trophy League—and a 'second tier' league – the Development League—which we hoped would attract both older club members and newer bowlers.

The Trophy League was regionalized, featuring a West/Central League and a South/Citrus League. Holmby came out on top on the West/Central and Sun City won the South/Citrus. Holmby then went on to win a close playoff final, 16-14.

Mainly due to the work of Pat Gonzalez, Long Beach entered 3 teams in the Development League. All of these teams, even though they had novices in them, did well in the competition; the 49ers just beating out the Patriots to win the Development Trophy.

The Winter League fills the gap in the tournament schedule, and is played during the months of January thru March.

USA WINS 10-STAR INTERNATIONAL AT SANTA MONICA

Ten happy bowlers representing the red, white and blue took the winner's circle March 11th as United States bowlers captured Santa Monica LBC's 2nd annual Jack Beckley "10-Star International" tournament.

The victory netted Team USA \$1,000 in take home green, and South African runners-up \$200 for the day's work. Tournament was sponsored by Linda and Norman Cohen, in memory of popular SMLBC member Jack Beckley, Mrs. Cohen's father. The entire Cohen family was present for the prize and trophy presentations.

The victorious USA team was captained by Bill Reidy, and featured Tony Baer, Sam Benjamin, Chris Booth, Rosa Gandara, Anne Nunes, Jim Olsen, Michael Siddall, Joe Siegman and Roger Teske. Other team captains were: Ivan Hyland–S.Africa, Peter White–Europe, and Houdini Ho–Rest of the World.

The unique tournament format pitted four teams of ten players representing the USA, South Africa, Europe and the Rest of World. Each team played singles, pairs, triples and rinks against their "international" opponents using a Quinnell scoring system. Players were all Southern Californian bowlers, with team rosters based upon "nationality" at age 21.

The competition attracted an unusually large crowd of spectators, among them avid Westside bowlers along with curious park visitors. Considering the field of competitors featured of a large number of top-ranked American bowlers, spectators were treated to a morning and afternoon of spectacular bowls.

Each of the four team captains selected and organized their respective teams. The tournament was created and directed by Alan Power, and the event included a spectacular luncheon buffet organized by Dixie Vanderloop and Rosanna Power.
